A few years ago it came to the Branch's attention that Care Staff and other BHCC staff who have to work bank holidays as part of their standard working hours; have not been getting the same pay and benefits as others. This discrepancy potentially leaves hundreds of workers significantly out of pocket.

Throughout this period, the Branch has regularly raised this as an **equal pay issue** with BHCC, as it disproportionately affects women workers, but it has continued to be unresolved. However, the Branch is pleased to have **recently re-started constructive discussions** on this continuing inequity and feel confident that we are working with the organisation to find a fair and equitable solution. Our aim to ensure that **any payments for bank holidays are levelled up** so that the payments are equal for all staff working on those days.



Care workers have put their own, and their family's wellbeing at risk throughout this pandemic to continue to provide vital services to hundreds of the city's most vulnerable residents. They do this on low rates of pay, and in a sector that is heading for a worsening recruitment crisis. We hope that BHCC will take this valuable opportunity to **reward that incredible commitment by ensuring Care Workers are fairly treated** in terms of pay and benefits; and demonstrate its commitment to true equality and inclusivity.
