Year after year local government and schools staff have been overlooked in pay negotiations. Yet again, public sector workers are being asked to effectively take a pay cut, with an offer that falls massively short of inflation, and takes no account of cost of living increases. In Brighton & Hove the average rent is now 70% of average wages, and house prices have gone up 500% in 20 years.

YOU COULD BE A MAGISTRATE!

Brighton & Hove Unison was recently approached by the Sussex Magistry as they want to recruit more magistrates in the area, but particular to increase their diversity by reaching more members of Black and Minority Ethnic communities, people under the age of 50, people from non-managerial or professional occupations, members of the trans community and people with a disability who are able, either unassisted or with reasonable adjustments, to carry out the full range of a magistrate's duties. FLEXIBLE WORKING & EQUALITY



The branch recently responded, with Brighton & Hove City Council to a request from central government to provide opinions on flexible working.

While we all welcome more flexibility, we also fed back that it is important that this does not inedvertently exacerbate existing inequalities. For example, it is important women workers, who are statistically more

likely to be carers still benefit from office working, while ensuring men also experience the work-life balance benefits of home working. You may find <u>this report</u> interesting.
